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Prepare students by....

- Sharing initial life story snippets of older participants + photos to build curiosity, greeting postcards
- · Role play to build conversation skills
- Show videos to reflect possible attributes of older participants, language, softly spoken, appearance.
 Discuss communication tips for vision & hearing assist.
- · End of life sensitivities
- · Living with dementia
- Making sure you give students ample time to ask questions and voice concerns
- Going through session logistics before hand to boost confidence and understanding.







Prepare older participants by....

- Assuring them that young children and teenagers are d efinitely interested in the personal histories and stories of older people.
- Some students may not have grandparents or other old er people to speak with and enjoy this time.
- Talking about purpose and positive role modeling.
- Discussing possible scenarios and how children may fe el, present, react.
- Show videos to reflect possible attributes of students a nd age group, language, conversation, appearance.
- Showing and demonstrating technology if online (video conference) format is being used.
- Remind and encourage them to ask students some que stions, to foster conversation and a reciprocal interacti on.







Prepare teachers and aged care staff by...

- Discussing their objectives and success criteria to gain mutual ly agreed goals. Ensure sufficient number of staff with respect to the number of older and younger participants.
- Fostering communication between the teacher (early childho od or school) and aged care staff.
- Plan a timeline for each session to maximise time for activitie s. Decide who is doing what and for how long.
- Preparation of activities, room, equipment, food, games and any props etc, plus risk assessment for both age groups.
- Regular communication each week between teachers and age d care staff to discuss activities and any changes
- Diplomatic skills to manage 'air time' of participants. Some lik e to speak a lot, others need to be encouraged to speak
- Change in role for Teachers: from being the main person spe aking, to encouraging students as main persons speaking.
